Later, as a successful businesswoman, Ms. Barnes mentored young entrepreneurs on how to turn passion and vision into successful ventures. Ms. Barnes' compassion and respect for the elderly has granted her the opportunity to serve as the CEO of the "New Life Senior Resort"-a fourteen (14)-unit residence for the elderly sponsored by the City of Refuge Worship Center. This multi-million dollar venture allows eligible seniors to live independently in a safe and secure community.
