Tribal Affairs Caucus



The IAEM-USA Tribal Affairs Caucus formed in 2000, monitors issues of emergency management relating to tribal governments in the United States.

There are 566 sovereign tribal nations with formal nation-to-nation relationships with the US government.

There are 334 recognized Indian reservations set aside under federal law as territories of tribal self-government for the preservation of Native cultures.

Objectives: Facilitate emergency services and program awareness in Indian Country within a framework of tribal self-determination.

Accomplishments: Furthered recruitment to revitalize and sustain Caucus membership.

- Provided support to membership through partnership engagements such as EMAP subscriptions and IAEM AEM/CEM sponsorships from other IAEM partners.
- ➤ Coordinated stakeholder presentations from partners to enhance awareness of their programs in direct support of Tribal EM programs.
