Steuben County Response and Recovery to Tropical Storm Fred, August 18, 2021

This presentation will cover the response and recovery of Tropical Storm Fred which hit Steuben County on August 18, 2021. The disaster led to a Federally Declared Disaster Declaration for New York State and covered more than \$30M of Public Infrastructure Damage just in Steuben County alone. The recovery efforts outline the implementation of the local COAD and focus on the use of volunteer groups and the distribution of more than \$600,000 of local funding for disaster victims absent an IA Declaration.

Speaker Biography

Tim Marshall is the Director of Public Safety for Steuben County. He has been an employee with Steuben County since September of 1997 serving as the Deputy Director of Emergency Services, then Director in 2012. Tim was appointed as Director of Public Safety in 2021. Tim is a Certified Emergency Manager with the International Association of Emergency Managers. He holds an Associate's Degree in Fire Protection Technology and a Bachelor's Degree in Emergency Management. Tim has forty years of Fire and Emergency Management experience, teaching and lecturing on various different topics. He has worked such disasters as the World Trade Center Attacks on 9/11, Severe Weather Events and other local emergencies. Most recently he served as the Operations Section Chief for the County's COVID-19 response which was the largest activation in County history. A longtime member of the Bath Volunteer Fire Department, Tim has also served as Disaster Chairman of the Northern Steuben Chapter of the American Red Cross. He served on the chapter's Board of Directors for seven years and held the position of Board Chair in 1995.
