IAEM-USA Announces the 2023 Clayton R. Christopher Memorial Award

Oct. 19, 2023 (Falls Church, Va.) – The IAEM-USA Awards & Recognition Committee of the International Association of Emergency Managers (IAEM) has selected Kimberly Spill-Cristiano, CEM, for the IAEM-USA 2023 Clayton R. Christopher Memorial Award. The award will be presented at the President's Banquet and Awards Ceremony on Nov. 8 at the 71st IAEM Annual Conference & EMEX in Long Beach, California.

Kimberly Spill-Cristiano, CEM Winner of the IAEM-USA Clayton R. Christopher Memorial Award

Kimberly, a dedicated and influential figure in the field of emergency management, has made substantial contributions to the South Florida region's preparedness and response efforts. She initiated the City of Pompano Beach's first emergency management program and was crucial in establishing Broward County's inaugural intra-governmental CERT Committee. Her leadership extended to representing emergency management in the South Florida Regional Domestic Security Task Force, guiding funding allocation for critical preparedness initiatives.

Kimberly's remarkable leadership was evident in her response to significant incidents, including the 2021 Surfside Building Collapse, 2022 Hurricane Ian, 2023 Texas Operation Lone Star, and 2005 Hurricane Katrina. Her extensive involvement in various emergency management organizations, such as FEMA, FEPA, and IAEM, highlights her commitment to the field. Kimberly's educational background, including a Master's in Homeland Security and defense from the Naval Postgraduate School, underscores her dedication to improving emergency management practices.

Kimberly's influence on South Florida's emergency management community is undeniable. She has garnered the respect and support of her peers through her unwavering dedication to continuously improving emergency management efforts. Her ability to bridge tactical and policy aspects of emergency management, coupled with her collaborative nature, has enhanced the region's ability to address the complex challenges faced in emergency management today and in the future.
