IAEM R9 Symposium Update

The symposium planning team has formally met 8 times this year (the next meeting is June 19th), selecting a venue, coordinating for discounted hotel blocks, conducting a call for speakers, finalizing the symposium program, and working on networking events including a fantastic social planned for August 11th at the Elks Lodge in Waikiki. We have locked in a number of sponsors, and are set to surpass the sponsorship for our last symposium in 2023. We are still finalizing the networking events scheduled for each night with more details to follow.

We will have a keynote from the administrator of the Hawaii Office of Homeland Security, and an interactive state/local emergency management panel facilitated by our own Todd DeVoe, CEM, MPA, IAEM 2nd VP. The detailed program with session information and speaker bios is posted to the symposium website.

Registration includes continental breakfast, all day beverage service, buffet lunch and parking on both days. We're also offering the certification exam the day after the symposium from 1 - 3:30 pm.

In addition, <u>NDPTC</u> and <u>TEEX</u> are offering a number of courses the week following the symposium. **We hope that you're able to join us and encourage everyone to register as soon as possible (NOTE: Early registration deadline is 13 June). Annual Board Meeting

The IAEM-USA Board met April 23-24 in Omaha, Nebraska to finalize and adopt the 2025-26 budget, evaluate the management firm performance, address crisis communications, update the Administrative Policies & Procedures, solidify plans for National Emergency Management Awareness Month (August), and Emergency Management on the Hill Day (June 25), review Community Impact Task Force progress, assessed Omaha as a potential conference site for 2029, and more. The Board carefully assessed the potential impact of current economic and federal funding changes on IAEM operations. It also considered 35 different funding requests representing an impressive level of activity and engagement within IAEM-USA groups, and assessed management effort and fees.

This was my first annual board meeting, and I learned a lot about how the board operates, and future plans for the organization. We discussed the importance of engaging with our membership on a regular basis, and shared best practices and lessons learned from each of the regions.

On June 12th we held a webinar led by Hannah Ritz and Heather Long to discuss the requirements for becoming an Associate Emergency Manager (AEM[®]) or Certified Emergency Manager (CEM[®]). We're looking at potentially hosting another webinar in July prior to the exam scheduled for 14 August after the R9 Symposium.

NOTE: To be included in this year's recognition ceremony at the IAEM annual conference:

- Submit your completed application by August 31, 2025, and have it approved before or during the September review.
- Pass the certification exam and have it processed by October 16, 2025.
- Complete the awards ceremony participation survey sent in October.
