IAEM Scholarship Program Application Now Open -- closing 11:59:59 p.m. EDT, 5/30/25

Since its inception, the IAEM Scholarship program has provided \$195,250 in scholarships to 82 students

To celebrate the Scholarship Program's 25th Anniversary, they will be offering a one-time \$10,000 award for **doctoral research students**. It is named to honor Dr. E.L. Quarantelli, a pioneering scholar in disaster research and emergency management.

In addition to this special award, scholarships will also be awarded to **full-time undergraduate** students, as well as **full- and part-time graduate** students. Last year, four students were awarded between \$4,000 and \$5,000 each.
