Presentation Abstract:

Imagine having Emergency Management responsibility for a university that occupies over 240 buildings in a major US metropolitan area, two portal campuses in China and the UAE, 15 global academic centers on six continents, and faculty-led trips to over 120 countries abroad. This presents a wide spectrum of capability and ability to respond to emergency situations from robust to extremely limited. To meet this variable challenge, NYU has developed a global emergency management program based on NIMS principles and EMAP guidance that also leverages the value of open-source analysis for detecting events, developing decision-quality information, and providing situational awareness for a wide range of stakeholders. This presentation by three of NYU's leaders will outline the structure of the NYU Global Emergency Management Program and how this systems functions in practice by providing specific examples from the January 2020 Middle East tensions and the ongoing Coronavirus outbreak originating in China. This presentation will also discuss global alerting, risk assessment, emergency operations such as evacuations, continuity planning, as well as two functional exercises conducted between the portal campuses in Shanghai and Abu Dhabi and the team in New York City.
