RESEARCH OVERVIEW

Through a content-theme analysis, this study proves that Florida counties with the state's largest immigrant populations do not adequately account for the social vulnerability of immigrant and migrant populations.

RESULTS

This simple test has revealed a consistent state-wide gap between Florida counties' emergency management plans and immigrant populations. However, some positive deviants worth noting include:

BEST PRACTICES

- Miami-Dade uses frontline organizations to get in touch with migrant laborers who don't trust the government
- Collier County established a hate-group registry and defining them as hazards
