BACKGROUND

The Institute for Disaster Management (IDM) at the University of Georgia offers one of the nation's six Master of Public Health (MPH) programs with a concentration in Disaster Management. IDM's two-year MPH program core curriculum includes four required courses in addition to elective courses and a 300-hour internship.

Hands-on experiential learning techniques were incorporated throughout core curriculum disaster management courses to enhance graduate student learning experiences.

- Semester-long case studies of rural communities where students collaborated to create emergency preparedness programs for their respective communities
- Discussion- and operations-based exercises to expose students to emergency preparedness exercises
- Hands-on certification training opportunities to allow students to matriculate with certifications that confer advantages in applying for jobs post-graduation


