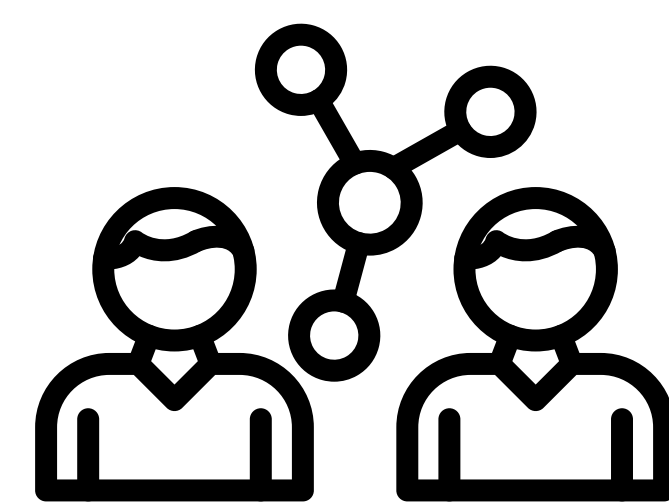

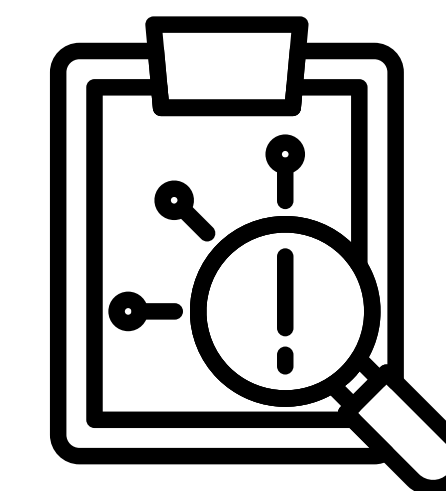


COMMISSIONERS

COMMISSIONER RESPONSIBILITIES

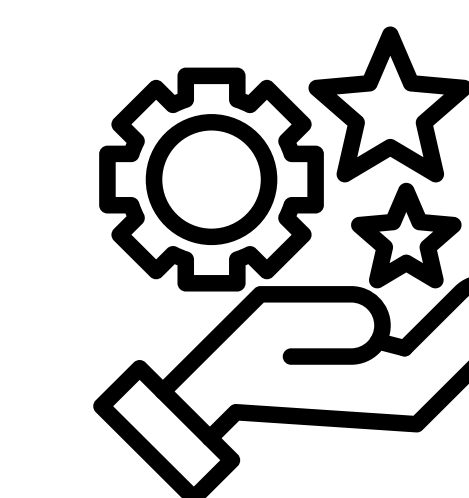
- » Review applications and make decisions about granting, maintaining, recertifying, and managing the scope of certification

The Call for Commissioners opens each spring



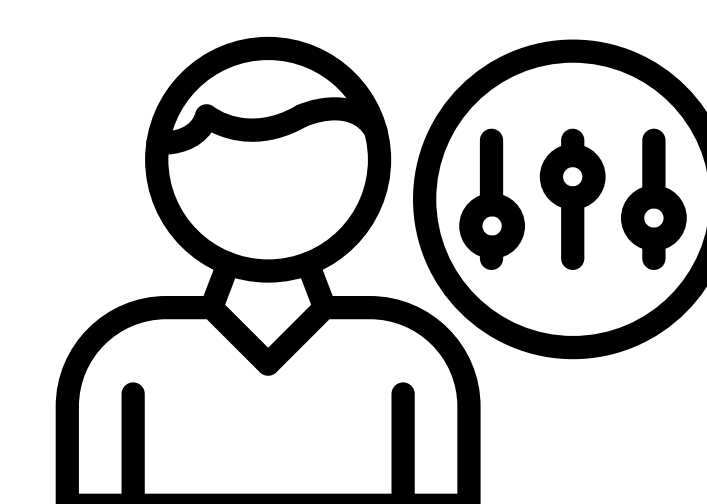
REQUIREMENTS TO BECOME A COMMISSIONER

- » Demonstrate integrity by working without bias and while maintaining confidentiality
- » Current CEM who has recertified at least once
- » Commit 30 hours every other month
- » Serve a three-year term
- » IAEM membership is NOT required



BENEFITS OF SERVING AS A COMMISSIONER

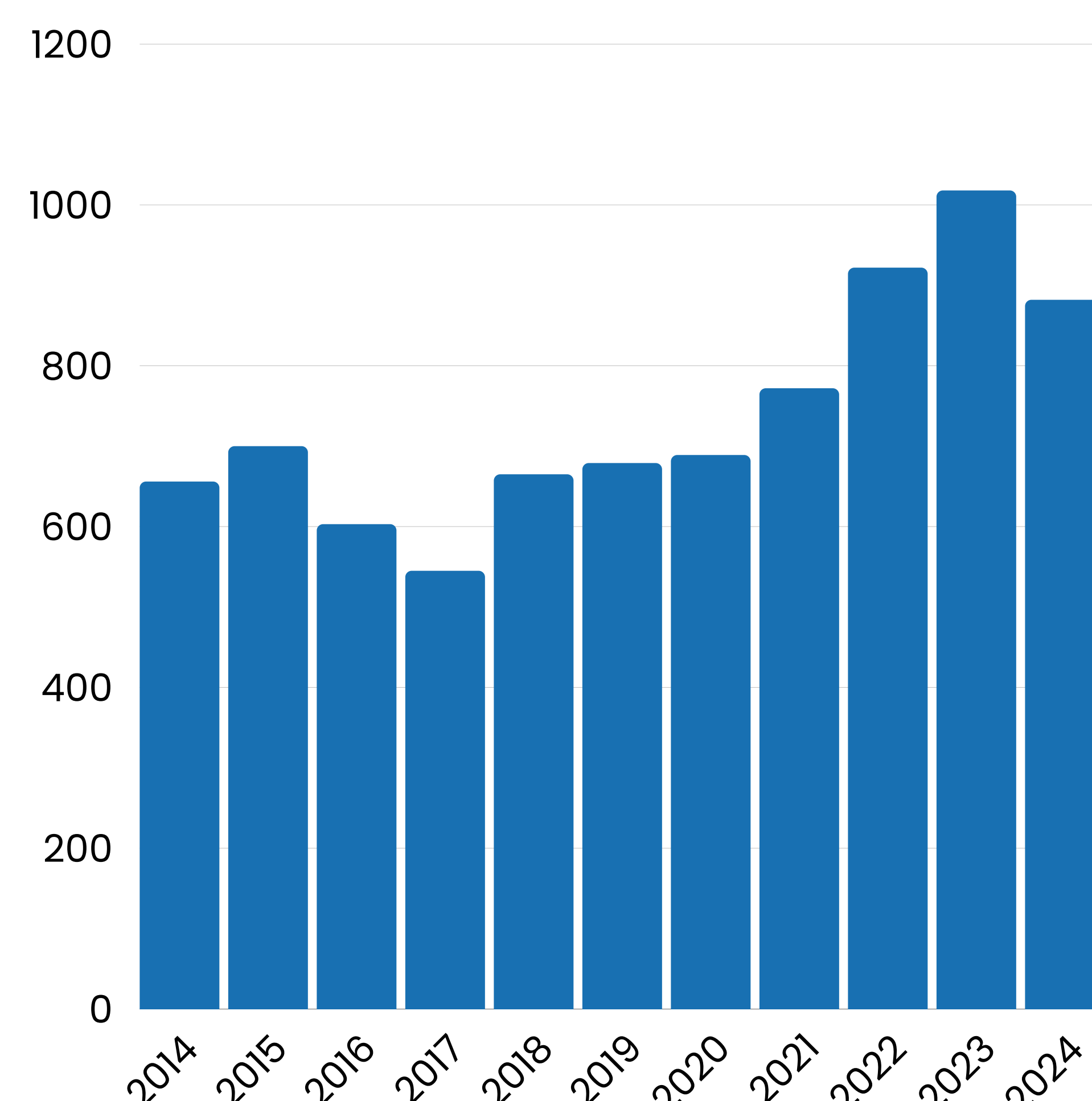
- » Shape the future of the certification program
