Why Earn A Certification?

Certification Fee: The current fees are listed on the IAEM website at www.iaem.org/certification. The certification fee entitles candidates to:

- Sit for the exam twice (if the candidate does not pass the exam on the first attempt).
- Certification application reviewed twice (if the application is not approved the first time).

The Steps:

- Complete the Certification Enrollment form on the IAEM website: www.iaem.org/ CertificationEnrollment
- 2. Pay the certification fee.
- Complete the below two steps within one year of each other (order doesn't matter):
 - a. Pass a multiple choice exam
 - **b.** Approval of certification application
- 4. Recertification is required every 5-years by documenting continuing education and contributions to the profession.

Levels of Certification

There are two types of certifications offered: the Associate Emergency Manager (AEM®) and the Certified Emergency Manager (CEM®)



CEM® Requirements

Complete all requirements listed below, including AEM® requirements:

Emergency Management Experience

Three years by date of application.
Comprehensive experience must include participation in a full-scale exercise, two functional exercises, actual disaster, or a major public event such as a major sporting event, state visit, or special event, and must encompass all phases of emergency management (mitigation, preparedness/ prevention, response and recovery). Note: a baccalaureate degree in emergency management reduces the experience requirement (depending on how current the degree is) and waives EM Training if it is earned very recently.

Contributions to the Profession

Submissions must be within the last 10 years. Six separate contributions are required in areas such as professional membership, conference attendance, service role, leadership role, special assignment, speaking, teaching, course development, publication, audio-visual

and interactive products, awards or special recognition, professional certification related to emergency management, or legislative contact. See the application for more details on each area.

Education

- U.S. applicants—Any four-year baccalaureate degree.
- Europa & Oceania applicants—Any baccalaureate degree.
- Canadian applicants—Any three or four-year baccalaureate degree or program. Or, any post-graduate degree in EM or related field.
- Asian, Latin American & International applicants—Any baccalaureate degree or equivalent thereof, or additional experience may be substituted at two years of full time Emergency Management employment per year of college/university.

AEM® Requirements

Training

Submissions must be within the last 10 years. 200 contact hours are required; 100 each in emergency management and general management. Emergency management training is considered specific to the profession, and general management includes content that can be applied beyond emergency management. Note: no more than 25% of hours can be in any single topic.

Letters of Reference

One signed letter on official letterhead from candidate's current supervisor, plus contact information for two additional references, with the option to provide two additional signed letters of reference on letterhead if candidate feels it would be helpful to his/her application.

Multiple-Choice Examination

Candidates must pass a multiplechoice examination. The exam is taken
electronically and administered by
an approved proctor. IAEM provides
a Study Guide that outlines who is
considered an approved proctor, as
well as a list of test content sources.
The examination includes a portion of
questions that are considered to be
universal core content for emergency
management regardless of location.
Additional content is tested based on the
candidate's geographic location.
