Mr. Frank DeAngelis

Frank DeAngelis was the principal at Columbine High School for three years on April 20, 1999. Since the tragic shooting that took fifteen lives and redefined a nation, and his career, he has spoken at a variety of conferences telling his story about the event through the aftermath.

Since the tragedy, he has remained a highly visible presence in the discussion of school safety, which changed drastically as lessons of the law enforcement response that day were transformed into policy. He has assisted as a consultant after a number of other violent school events, including Virginia Tech, Sandy Hook and Parkland. His presentation will reveal the leadership lessons he learned in the focus of an international firestorm. His honest, straight-forward account provides his audience invaluable insights into managing the aftercrisis with students, staff members, community members and never-ending media attention.

Mr. DeAngelis has been involved in numerous professional activities and associations, and has received multiple awards for his teaching, leadership, and coaching skills. He was selected as Colorado Principal of the Year in 2013, and narrowly missed being named the National

Principal of the year. He retired from Columbine in June of 2014 and now works as a consultant, for safety and emergency management, for the Colorado Jefferson County School District.
